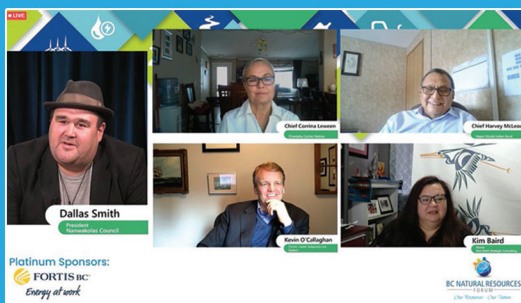
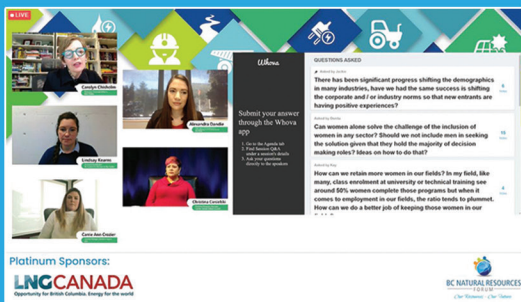

A New Approach at the 2021 Forum!

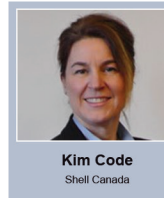
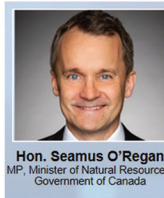
